



Michael Wissot's 6-Point Plan To Achieve Common Sense Environmental Policy

- 1) Reduce air pollution from power plants, a major source of CO₂ emissions, by developing a cap-and-trade system that relies on market-based incentives, in compliance with the Clear Skies Initiative, to spur energy-saving and pollution-reducing technologies.**
- 2) Strengthen hazardous waste prevention programs for businesses by offering on-site technical assistance, streamlining permit procedures, conserving energy, and creating more disposal alternatives.**
- 3) Advocate air and water quality goals for California, as well as empower local communities with neighborhood oversight initiatives and better environmental information.**
- 4) Utilize leading water quality enhancement techniques and implement stronger standards for safe drinking water.**
- 5) Promote public workshops on the prevention of lead contamination and provide better resources for low income areas to reduce lead hazards, as well as requiring the lead industry to work more closely with the EPA on monitoring lead contamination levels.**
- 6) Build stronger ties with the World Trade Organization and its member countries in establishing environmental standards on packaging, labeling, and recycling, along with greater environmental transparency within our multilateral trading system.**
